SUBJECT: In-Vial Transportation of Pfizer/Comirnaty™ COVID-19 Vaccine Preferred

Dear Health Care Providers:

Pfizer recently released a communication that recommended <u>against</u> transporting <u>pre-filled</u> <u>syringes</u> of the Pfizer/Comirnaty[™] COVID-19 vaccines that have a gray cap. This would include the following products:

- Pfizer/Comirnaty[™] monovalent vaccine for 12 years and older (currently **not** available in Manitoba)
- Pfizer/Comirnaty[™] bivalent vaccine for 12 years and older.

Due to the abundance of vaccine available, providers should transport Pfizer/Comirnaty[™] COVID-19 vaccine in vials if moving from one site to another (e.g., home visits, between nursing stations). It is still acceptable to transport pre-filled syringes of Pfizer/Comirnaty[™] COVID-19 vaccine within a clinic or building so long as the vaccine is administered within 12 hours of first puncture of the vial.

If transporting Pfizer/Comirnaty™ COVID-19 vaccine in pre-filled syringes outside of a clinic or building is the only opportunity to administer a vaccine to a client, then providers may do so. However, please limit the use of this option as much as possible.
