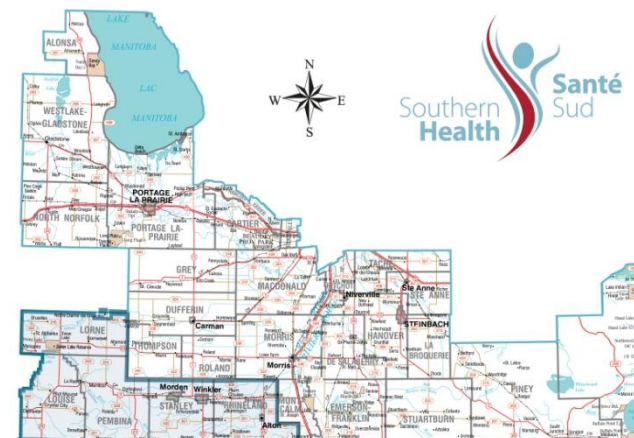

- 49,344 total population (2015).
- Remarkable 10-year population growth – second highest area in region at 23.2%.
- Young and growing population.
- Higher proportion males than females.
- Higher proportion of young children (0-4 years) compared to province.
- Higher proportion of senior population (75+ years) compared to region.
- Largest population increases in Winkler City (44%) and Morden City (37%).
- Population decrease in Louise Municipality (-6%), Pembina Municipality (-5%), and Rhineland Municipality (-5%).

Health Status (RHA Atlas 2013)

Premature Mortality Rate (2007-2011) – best single indicator of health status measuring death of population before 75 years. Manitoba rate: 3.12 deaths per 1,000 residents aged 0-74 years.

- **Statistically lower (better) than Manitoba rate**
Stanley (1.67), Altona (2.10), Winkler (2.35)
- **Statistically same as Manitoba average**
Morden (2.42), Lorne/Louise/Pembina (2.81)

Diabetes Prevalence (2009-2012) – percent of residents (age 19+) with Type 1 or 2 diabetes. Manitoba rate: 9.96%.

- **Statistically lower (better) than Manitoba rate**
Stanley (5.75%), Altona (6.78%), Winkler (7.30%), Morden (7.91%)
- **Statistically same as Manitoba rate**
Lorne/Louise/Pembina (9.27%)

Hypertension Prevalence (2011-2012) – percent of residents (age 19+) with “high blood pressure”. Manitoba rate: 25.6%.

- **Statistically lower (better) Manitoba rate**
Stanley (20.7%), Winkler (22.2%), Altona (23.3%)
- **Statistically same as Manitoba rate**
Lorne/Louise/Pembina (24.7%), Morden (25.5%)

Heart Attack Rates (2007-2011) – rate of death or hospitalization due to acute myocardial infarction (AMI) for residents age 40+. Manitoba rate: 4.09 per 1,000 residents aged 40 and older.

- **Statistically same as Manitoba rate**
Winkler (3.65), Stanley (4.03), Altona (4.82), Lorne/Louise/Pembina (4.93), Morden (5.17)

Mood and Anxiety Disorder Prevalence (2007-2012) – percent of residents (age 10+) with mood and anxiety disorder. Manitoba rate: 23.3%.

- **Statistically lower (better) than Manitoba rate**
Stanley (12.6%), Altona (16.4%), Winkler (17.4%), Morden (17.8%)
- **Statistically same as Manitoba rate**
Lorne/Louise/Pembina (19.8%)

Dementia Prevalence (2007-2012) – percent of residents (age 55+) with dementia. Manitoba rate: 10.6%.

- **Statistically same as Manitoba rate**
Stanley (6.9%), Lorne/Louise/Pembina (8.6%), Morden (10.0%), Altona (11.2%), Winkler (12.0%)

NOTE: If a rate is statistically higher or lower than the Manitoba rate, it means that we are 95% confident that it is not due to chance.
